

Apples, Standard Varieties

Need two varieties for cross pollination. Trees should be within 100' of a pollinator tree. Early bloomers should be planted with early or midseason bloomers. Late bloomers with late or mid-season bloomers. Full sun. Generally, begin bearing 5-8 years after planting

Haralred, Apple

A Bailey Nurseries introduction, the fruit is redder and earlier than Haralson apple. Very juicy, tart, firm, good keeper, extremely hardy and firelight resistant. Unsuitable pollinator. Note: Unsuitable pollinator for Haralson.

Honeygold, Apple

Exceptional cold hardiness. The flesh is crisp, white and sweet. Delicious for eating. Good disease resistance.

A cross between Sharon and Connell Red apple. Snowsweet has delicious, sweet, slightly tart taste. Slow to oxidize when exposed to air. Honeycrisp is a good pollinator. Above average resistance to scab and fireblight. Cold hardy apple.

State Fair, Apple

U of M selection with medium sized red striped fruit. Flavor is sprightly tart and good for eating and baking. Good texture, semi-acid to sweet. All purpose apple. One of the better early apples for northern locations. Shorter storage life.

Sweet Sixteen, Apple

U of M selection with medium sized red striped apple with crisp, juicy texture. Excellent sweet unusual flavor like charry candy. Outstanding dessert apple. Fireblight resistant.

Zestar, Apple

U of M selection. At last, an early apple that is crispy, juicy and with a hint of brown sugar flavor. Best known for its sweet tart flavor. Has a much longer storage life than other early apples. Excellent for eating and cooking. Fruit is about 3” in diameter.

Semi Dwarf Varieties

Semi-dwarf trees grow to be approximately 60% of the size of a standard apple, which also bears fruit earlier than a standard apple. Usually 4-5 years after planting. Need two varieties for cross pollination. Trees should be within a 100’ of a pollinator tree. Early bloomers should be planted with early or midseason bloomers. Late bloomers with late or midseason bloomers. Full sun.

Connell Red, Dwarf Apple

U of M selection with intense red color. A hardy, heavy bearer with large size fruit. Excellent for eating or cooking. Distinctive flavor. Fruit keeps well until April or May. Unsuitable pollinator for Fireside apple.

Fireside, Dwarf Apple

U of M selection with large red striped fruit and a sweet, pleasant flavor. Excellent flavor and good for eating. Good storage life. One of the most popular apples in MN. Resistant to cedar apple rust. Unsuitable pollinator for Connell red apple.

Freedom, Dwarf Apple

This red juicy fruit is large and good for eating, sauces and juice. The flesh is crisp and juicy with a slight tart flavor. The fruit will keep until January in cold storage. Very vigorous and productive tree. Developed for disease resistance. Immune to apple scab and resistant to mildew, cedar-apple rust and fireblight. Does not require fungicide sprays.

Selection from U of M, unique small and very sweet, intense taste. Crisp but firm texture and juicy. Extremely cold hardy. Great for cider or cooking. Parent to “Keepsake” and “Sweet Sixteen” and grandparent to “Honeycrisp.”

Haralson, Dwarf Apple

U of M selection with medium sized red fruit. A hard, crisp and tart apple. Good dual-purpose apple. One of the most popular apples in MN. Often fruits the first year. Prone to biennial bearing. Keeps well, will store until March. Unsuitable pollinator for Haralred apple.

U of M introduction, cross of Honeycrisp and Zestar. Well colored fruit. Excellent crisp, juicy texture. Sweet well-balanced flavor with occasional tropical overtones.

Kindercrisp, Dwf Apple

Exceptional flavor and crisp texture, much like its parent, Honeycrisp, this early ripening variety features much smaller fruit/ Perfect size for snacking or kids lunches, with a good balance of sweet flavors and a crisp, juicy bite. Outstanding variety. The fruit is best fresh from the tree.
