Blueberries

Plant two varieties for maximum pollination and fruit production. Full sun.

A pH of 2.4 -5.5 is good for blueberries. They need acidic soil. Plant in full sun, along with ample moisture for maximum fruit set. For best fruit set, plant two or more varieties for cross pollination. Winter protection may increase yields.

Blueberries, Chippewa

A sweet berry with a more upright growth habit. A good plant for the home gardener, large dark blue fruit and good blueberry flavor! Glossy green leaves turn bright red in the fall. Self-fruitful. U of M introduction.

Grapes, Bluebell

Best for fresh eating, jelly, winemaking. U of M introduction. Highly resistant to disease. Berry is medium – large. Dark blue – black color.

Grapes, Frontenac

A red wine grape developed by the U of M. Produces very good quality juice for wine making. A vigorous grower with good disease resistance to downy and powdery mildew.

Best for eating fresh or for juice and wine. U of M introduction. Yellow – gold berries. Sweet taste, juicy texture. Pest and disease resistance.
